# "Peace Be with You"

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."

John 20:19 (NRSV)

Maybe we are getting ahead of the season with this meditation. The lives of the disciples had been turned upside down. The rabbi they had followed had been executed and his body had been hastily placed in a tomb. Because this had happened only an hour or so before sundown, which marked the beginning of the Sabbath, the usual burial rituals had not been completed. And now there were reports from women and men who had been to the tomb that his body was no longer there. They feared they might be next on the list of those to be executed.

And then, as if by magic (or as if by Star Trek transporter), Jesus is standing in their midst. And then He says "Peace be with you", which is presumably meant to reassure them. What did that statement mean to them almost two thousand years ago? What does that statement mean to us today.

We are still searching for answers to those questions. There are hints in different scripture passages. We are reassured in Psalm 23 that we do not journey through the Dark Valley alone. Paul reassures his readers that in spite of the beatings and floggings and shipwrecks, that he is blessed.

This poem by Mary Lee Friesz offers some insight into that question:

### "The Only Son"

He is the only true son of our father;
the rest of us are adopted, you know.
He is ever generous with his wealth.
He says that he came to show
us the love that our father could share –
the Way, the Truth, and the Light.
If we look to his Word, he will
teach us to tap into his might.
