Developing a complete Christian theology from a movie can be fraught with problems. However, there may be some valuable lessons we can learn.

Since December when this movie was shown as the Second Saturday Cinema, I have been struck with some thoughts I would like to share.

Each of us is on a journey through life along a path, as I envision the process, which was uniquely designed for each of us and, dare I say, pre-ordained for each of us. Do any of us stay on our own path absolutely all the time? Simply stated and in a single word – "No".

So, what are we to do? We, that is, I need to refocus my life, recognize that I strayed from the path, seek God's face and confess that I have sinned. Then I need to change direction, to repent, and ask for forgiveness. When Peter asked Jesus how many times he should forgive his brother, Jesus told Peter that he should forgive his brother not seven times, but he should forgive him seventy times seven.

What does the brother have to do in order to earn that forgiveness? What if the wrong or grudge occurred long ago in the past? What if the wrong occurred two, or even five or twenty, years ago? Is there an expiration date on confessing and accepting the forgiveness?

For me, this is the message from the movie quote. What matters is not the severity of the wrong or how long ago it happened. What matters is deciding to get back on the [pre-ordained] path.

And the cost? In the movie, the conductor punches a unique ticket for each passenger on the train. Tickets seem to be prepaid. The cost has already been paid.

Dear God, guide us to endeavor to stay focused on You and to seek You when we have strayed. Remind us of Your Christmas gift that was completed on the cross. In the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



Spotlight on Mission – PARX Race Track Ministry

PARX Race Track Ministry, also known Race Track Chaplaincy of America,

Pennsylvania Division, ministers all year to stable employees and backstretch workers and their families. RTCA provides dorms for over 200 workers on the track and provides beds and bedding, a food pantry, clothing, school supplies, toiletries, household items,



transportation, counseling and even social service assistance. In addition to special holiday programs, there are weekly "Chapel & Chow" (chapel service followed by catered meal) and weekly Bible studies.



Beginning in mid-July we will be collecting school supplies to for the needy children of behind-the-scenes employees. On Sunday afternoons, there will be a box in the chapel lobby for your donations of new pencils, pens, markers, notebooks, rulers, pencil boxes and other supplies.
