ATCHOO! MAY G-D BLESS YOU

It's allergy season again, friends, so we all must ready our tissues and nose drops, then join the constant chorus that sings *God bless you*. But I share with you a question I always ask during this season: Does God really bless us when we sneeze?

After my typical level of research, I want to share with you vital information I have learned. The phrase we know so well has ancient origins, but with numerous versions for us to analyze. Initially, be aware there is no mention of this concept in the Bible. Researchers consider the following: In ancient cultures, long before English language, words referring to good health or long life echoed the sneeze. But, as Jews, we may want to consult the Midrash for this "scholarly" nvestigation. Jews wish life to someone who sneezes in the form of "Labriut" in Hebrew and "tzu guzunt" in Yiddish. I frequently throw my blessings around a sneezer with the automatic response, "Guzundheit."

But why are we so programed to repeat this blessing for the common "Atchoo" that happens nearby? According to the Midrash theories, this strategic blessing presents the following historical background: In ancient times, sneezes were dangerous. They often served as a precursor for imminent death. Although yawns did not provoke a similar response, sneezes needed God's blessings. The story follows:

From the day that heaven and earth were created, no one was ever sick; if one was on the road or in the marketplace, he would sneeze, and his soul would leave by way of his nostrils. Until our forefather Jacob prayed to <u>G-d</u> about this, saying: "Master of all worlds! Don't take my soul from me before I have the opportunity to give instructions to my children and my household." G-d agreed with him, as the verse says: "After these events, Joseph was told, 'Behold, your father is ill." All of the peoples of the world heard of this and were amazed, since nothing like this had happened since heaven and earth were created. The <u>Midrash</u> concludes, we wish life to someone who sneezes, since it used to represent the opposite.

Jews in different countries translated these phrases into those that meant good health and went even further, allowing for the sneezer to reply. Some even replied with a verse:

"For your salvation I hope, G-d-" This was an expression of thanks to G-d for saving him or her from that danger.

Of course, we need to remember the good side of sneezing: "If a person sneezes while praying," the Talmud says, "it is a good sign for him." According to the Talmud, if during prayer people sneeze, that indicated their prayer has been accepted by G-d because they now feel better. Thus, sneezing was seen help from G-d to improve physically and religiously.

Lastly, we need to honor our noses that make all this possible. Because the nose is so essential to our well-being, the Jewish nose (I recently wrote about) is central to our life. We live only as long as the nose allows us to breathe. In the *Zohar* (Foundation work of the Kabbala) "G-d is the Master of the nose and Kabbalistic sources explain that scent represents a very high level of divine energy." In addition, within the Holy Temple, one of the most sacred services involved the burning of incense, which strongly entered the Temple air and prepared for the aroma of the arrival of the Moshiach (the Jewish messiah or redeemer at that particular time) who is wiser than Soloman and the prophet who rises to the level of Moses).

Indeed, a nose and its sneeze hold an honored place in our Jewish background, so prepare to honor your nose and bless one another as our allergies allow us to follow the sages throughout this holiday season. I have answered my own question, and I feel very blessed as I clutch my tissue box through the next few weeks.

JRC LECTURE SERIES Presents

Daniel Goldsmith Holocaust Survivor on June 26, 2024 in the PAC, 2 p.m.



Daniel Goldsmith was born in Antwerp, Belgium to an Orthodox Jewish family. His father was a plumber and his mother was a homemaker. He was 8 years old when the German army invaded in May 1940. His family tried to flee to France but was forced to return to Antwerp. In August 1942, his father was placed in a forced labor camp and his mother was forced to sell some of his tools to buy food for Daniel and his sister, Lillian.

After the Nazis raided their street one night in September 1942, arresting Jewish

families, Daniel's mother visited a known resistance movement member and within 48 hours Daniel and Lillian were placed in a Catholic convent. In December, Daniel was moved to a boy's orphanage and was given a false identification of "Willy Peters."

The orphanage was raided in May 1944 and Danny, with other boys, was arrested and sent to multiple prisons. On the way to the third prison the boys escape from the train. They ended up in Perwez, Belgium and the local priest hid the children in various homes in the village.

Danny was 12 years old when he was liberated in September 1944. In April 1948, Danny arrived in the United States.
