Is Your Edge Browser Up To Date?

General Meeting 9:30, September 7 LPT-08 Edge is *supposed* to update itself every time you launch it, but, well, sometimes it doesn't. Does it really matter? Yes. Updating your browser keeps it secure and working properly. Here's how to update Edge manually:

- 1. Launch Edge.
- 2. Click on the ellipsis (the three dots) in the upper right.
- 3. Click on Help and feedback.
- 4. Click on **About Microsoft Edge**.
- 5. Edge will automatically download and update.

Quickie Word Tip

Want a really fast way to change a block of text to all caps? Here's how:

- 1. Highlight the text.
- 2. Hold down both the **control key** and **shift Key** and tap the **A** key.

Erase Your External Drive Before Discarding or Donating

- 1. Before you get rid of your external drive, do this:
- 2. Right click the drive.
- 3. Click **Format...**.
- 4. Uncheck **Quick Format**.
- 5. Click **Start**.
- 6. Wait. It could take some time.
- 7. It is now safe to discard or donate your drive.

Enter URLs Quickly

You probably know that it's not necessary to type https:// or even www in the address block when entering an Internet address. For example, if you wanted to visit YouTube, you could type youtube.com and press Enter. But, to make things even quicker, if you are visiting a .com address such as youtube.com, you can type youtube and then press Ctrl+Enter to fill in the complete https://www.youtube.com address.

Don't Get Angry at Your Mobile Phone! Block Those Spam Calls!

Check out the site below for directions on how to implement the following three suggestions that can help you block **some** of those annoying calls. (These directions may not work for all phones.)

- 1. Enter your phone number in the FTC Do Not Call Registry.
- 2. Manually block calls from repeat phone numbers.
- 3. Install free spam filters from certain carriers; or, install paid spam filters from private companies.

Enter Windows 11's BIOS (UEFI)¹ by Pressing a Key

Sometimes you have to get into your BIOS to fix your computer when it's acting clunky. Here's one way: Use a key on your keyboard when you're powering up. The ADVANTAGE OF THIS METHOD IS THAT YOU CAN USE THIS EVEN WHEN YOUR WINDOWS OS DOESN'T LOAD.

To use this method, you will have to find the key that lets you enter BIOS on your specific computer. This key varies by manufacturer. When you depress the power button on your computer, the first screen that appears (usually showing the manufacturer's logo) **should** display a message at the bottom of the screen telling you which key you need to press to enter the BIOS. On most computers, this key is F2², but you should check at the bottom of the screen to confirm it.

Here's what to do:

- 1. Push your power button.
- 2. Continually tap the **F2** or **ESC** (or appropriate key).
- 3. The **Startup Menu** appears.

Install Cryptomator Vault Anywhere!

You still don't trust the cloud, but you want to encrypt some sensitive files. Well, you don't have to use the cloud. If you have Cryptomator* installed, it's easy. Here's how:

- 1. Open the Cryptomator app.
- 2. Click the plus (+) sign in the lower left corner.
- 3. Click the Create new vault option.
- 4. Select a location on the left side (USB drive, external drive, etc.).
- 5. Name your vault.
- 6. Enter a password; retype your password.
- 7. Click Create Vault.

That's it.

Manage tasks with Chrome's Task Manager

YOU KNOW HOW TO ACCESS WINDOWS' TASK MANAGER:

CTRL+SHIFT+Esc. But did you know that Chrome has its own task manager that can help you check which web page, extension, or app is causing you a problem? It also shows Chrome's memory usage and how it processes bandwidth.

On Windows, after launching Chrome, press **Shift** + **Esc** to open the Task Manager. On macOS, click **Window** in the menu bar at the top of your screen, then select **Task Manager**. If you have a Chromebook, press **Search** + **Esc** simultaneously to access it.
